Key Vocabulary

Coast	Where the sea meets the land.
Sea/Ocean	Areas of salty water. Seas are smaller than oceans.
Seaside	An area that is close to the sea, especially one where people go for their holiday.
Lighthouse	A tower or other structure containing a beacon light to warn or guide ships at sea.
Cliff	Steep rock faces especially at the edge of the sea.
Pier	A platform projecting from the shore into the sea.
Promenade	A paved, public walkway near to the sea front.
Harbour	A place on the coast where ships may moor in shelter.
Vegetation	The plant life of a region.
Rockpool	a pool of water among rocks.
Climate	the average weather in a place over many years.
Port	place where ships load or unload.
