ROCKS (Remembering Our Curriculum Knowledge and Skills)	
Seaside holidays were different in the past when we consider transport, clothing, activities and buildings.	
In the Victorian times (100 to 150 years ago) people visiting the seaside would wear their usual day clothes for walking on the beach.	
Victorians used bathing machines (show pictures) to get changed in. They would then be led by horse into the water where they could lower themselves into the sea without being seen.	
Grace Darling was born on 24th November 1815 in Bamburgh, Northumberland. On 6th September 1838 a massive storm wrecked the <i>SS Forfarshire</i> about 3/4 of a mile from the Longstone Lighthouse. Early on 7th September, Grace's father, William, assessed the situation and decided that he needed to try and rescue any survivors. His sons weren't at the lighthouse, so he took Grace with him in their rowing boat. William climbed the rocks to reach the sailors, and Grace stayed in control of the boat. The storm raged on, but Grace fought hard to keep the boat away from the rocks while her father rescued the survivors. Grace received money and recognition from Queen Victoria. She is a significant individual in British history.
