## School Uniform Policy

### General Statement of Intent

St Francis Xavier's School believes that a consistent school uniform policy is vital for:

- Promoting the ethos of a school.
- Providing a sense of belonging and identity.
- Setting an appropriate tone for education.

For the purposes of this policy, "uniform" includes the following elements of pupils' appearance:

- Clothing, including the school uniform itself, variations of the school uniform such as PE kits, and other clothing worn at school, e.g. non-uniform.
- Hairstyles and headwear.
- Jewellery and other accessories.
- Cosmetics such as makeup and nail polish.

The pupils at St. Francis Xavier's RC Primary School are expected to look smart and represent the school by wearing their uniform with pride. Parents are requested to adhere closely to the uniform requirements and to ensure that all items of uniform are clearly marked with their child's name using a name tape.

Our uniform has been reviewed in line with statutory guidance from the Department for Education (DfE) [Cost of school uniforms - GOV.UK](#). Whilst a pupil is wearing our school uniform he/she is representing the school and his/her standard of dress and behaviour should always reflect this, including on the journey to and from school.

## **Uniform List**

Girls' hair should be tied up, if a suitable length, and only black or green hairbands and accessories should be used. No hair gel please. Stud earrings only are permitted. No nail varnish or make up should be worn to school.

Boys' hair should be a suitable style for school and no shorter than a grade 3. No hair gel please. Please check with the headteacher if you have any queries.

### **Winter uniform for girls (Autumn and Spring Terms)**

School /plain white polo shirt (Yr R and Yr 1)  
White shirt and green school tie (not elasticated) (Yr 2-Yr 6)  
Grey skirt, grey pinafore dress or grey trousers  
School cardigan or bottle green cardigan  
Grey knee length socks/grey or bottle green tights  
Black shoes

### **Winter uniform for boys (Autumn and Spring Terms)**

School/plain white polo shirt (Yr R and Yr 1)  
White shirt and green school tie (not elasticated) (Yr 2-Yr 6)  
Long or short grey trousers  
School sweatshirt or bottle green v-necked sweater  
Grey or black socks  
Black shoes

### **Summer uniform for girls (Summer Term)**

Green and white checked knee length dress  
or school/ plain white polo shirt and grey skirt  
White socks (ankle or knee length)  
Black shoes or closed sandals

### **Summer uniform for boys (Summer Term)**

School /plain white polo shirt  
Long or short grey trousers  
Grey socks (ankle or knee length)  
Black shoes or closed sandals

### **P.E. Kit (indoor kit)**

Plain white t-shirt with no logo  
Navy shorts with no logo  
Plimsolls (preferably slip on)  
Short white socks (not trainer socks)

### **P.E. Kit (Outdoor kit for Year R, Years 1 and 2) *In addition to indoor PE kit***

Trainers  
School/plain black track suit (no logos) – jogging top and jogging bottoms

### **P.E. Kit (Outdoor kit for Years 3 to 6) *In addition to indoor PE kit***

Long white socks  
Shin pads
